



GETTING STARTED

School Hours

Students should arrive at school before 7.45am. Lessons are from 8:00am until 3.30pm. Students must be picked up before 4:00pm as no supervision is available after this time. Students from Year 1 to Year 6 have a daily assembly every morning at 07:50am whilst Secondary students are involved in their respective home tutor classes at this time. If late: Students who are late need to see Ms. My for Primary and Early Years (P201) or Ms. Lien for Secondary (S202).

Student Pick-Up

Only authorised people are allowed to collect your child and a school issued ID card is required. The ID card should be displayed when on school premises. Please inform the school when there are any changes to your circumstances or if you are nominating someone else to collect your child. Some children will travel home by bus.

Students who need to leave before the end of the day, need a permission slip from Head of Primary and Early Years or Head of Secondary.

Bus Service

Renaissance offers a safe, reliable cost-effective bus service. There are several customised routes covering the city, with a free service operating from Tao Dan Park and District 2. All buses have seatbelts, qualified and experienced drivers and an assistant. Please ask our Bus Assistant or Receptionist for more information on the bus routes available, and on our bus service fees.

Lunch & Snacks

The school provides free healthy snacks in the morning and afternoon for Early Years and Primary. For lunch, all students who wish to use the school's canteen have a choice between Vietnamese, Korean, Asian and Western dishes. A vegetarian option is also available each day. Younger children have options for their parents to choose from. Older children have a set menu or à la carte. A lunch menu is provided each month. Parents have the option of paying for their child's lunch or sending a packed lunch from home. Payments are made via a smart card which you can 'top-up'. If you would like your child to have a packed lunch, please provide the lunch at the start of the day. Homework

All children from Primary through Secondary have Home Learning (homework). This is a part of school life and is aimed at revising concepts introduced in the classroom and establishing a disciplined, self-study work ethic at home.

Extra Curricular Activities

The school has an extensive Extra-Curricular Activity Programme (ECA). Some activities are provided free of charge whilst others have a fee. Details of the ECA Programme are made available at the beginning of each term.

In Secondary, we have co-curricular activities and Extracurricular activities. Extracurricular activities (ECA) take place at lunch-times and after school and a calendar will be made available at the start of each term for students to join. Co-cocurricular activities (CCA) take place during the normal timetabled lesson time and will be explained to students at the start of each unit.

HEALTH & MEDICAL

School Nurse

Renaissance has its own school clinic with 2 fully trained nurses on site. Our nurses play important roles in looking after the children's physical and emotional well-being while contributing to Renaissance's aim of improving the health of our children and young people. For minor accidents, the nurses will take care of your child. In rare cases, if necessary, the nurses will arrange for a child to be taken to the nearby hospital. Of course, parents will be contacted and updated.

Medications

Students are not allowed to carry medication amongst personal belongings. Medicines must be given to the school nurse, with a note from the parent or guardian. Medications need to be in their original pharmacy container and marked with the student's name, name of the drug, its dosage and instructions. The nurses will contact you if clarification is needed.

Contagious Diseases

A child with communicable disease MUST be kept at home and not sent to school under any circumstances. Children are considered contagious during the following periods:

1. Coronavirus: COVID-19 affects different people in different ways. Most infected people will develop mild to moderate illness and recover without hospitalization.

- *Most common symptoms:* fever, dry cough, tiredness.
- *Less common symptoms:* aches and pains, sore throat, diarrhoea, conjunctivitis, headache, loss of taste or smell, a rash on skin, or discolouration of fingers or toes.
- *Serious symptoms:* difficulty breathing or shortness of breath, chest pain or pressure, loss of speech or movement.

Seek immediate medical attention if your child(ren) have serious symptoms.

The school should be notified immediately if your child has contracted or been in contact with any infectious disease.



- 2. Chicken pox:** 6 days from onset of rash
 - *Symptoms:* pocks or blisters have scabs and are found on parts of body that are usually covered by clothing.
- 3. German Measles (Rubella):** 7 days or until symptoms disappear
 - *Symptoms:* brief red rash, enlarged glands in the neck.
- 4. Mumps:** 9 days or until swelling disappears.
 - *Symptoms:* fever, swelling and tenderness of glands at angle of jaw.
- 5. Infectious Hepatitis:** 14 days from onset of clinical disease and at least 7 days from onset of symptoms.
 - *Symptoms:* headaches, abdominal pain, nausea, vomiting usually fever; skin and eyes may or may not turn yellow.
- 6. Infectious Mononucleosis:** Variable but usually 3-6 weeks.
 - *Symptoms:* fever, sore throat, malaise, swollen glands in the neck.
- 7. Scarlet Fever or Strep throat:** 7 days from onset if untreated or 48 hours after antibiotics.
 - *Symptoms:* sore throat, fever, vomiting, fine rash later for scarlet fever (not on face).
- 8. Conjunctivitis (pink eye):** The child SHOULD NOT attend school until treatment is effective. It is highly infectious and should be treated right away.
 - *Symptoms:* itching of the eyes, watering, redness, and discharge from eyes.
- 9. Cough:** When a child has a bad cough (a cold) or other common but highly contagious illness, parents are asked to keep the child home so that the illness is not spread to other children.
- 10. Head lice:** If a child is found to have head lice or nits, the parents will be contacted immediately and the child will be sent home. The whole class will be checked for head lice. Once any affected children have been treated at home they may return to school.

SUBJECTS & LANGUAGES



Subjects

Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS)

The EYFS curriculum is play based and specifically designed to provide equal opportunities for all children to develop skills and competencies, flourish as individuals and to achieve to the best of their ability in a child-centred learning environment. Our programme ensures students enjoy greater success with the consistency and natural progression of skill development to support a smooth transition into Primary School. By enrolling in our Early Years, parents are giving their children a great advantage in life as research shows the majority of children that complete the Early Years programme achieve at a higher level when compared to others.

The EYFS is broken down into 7 areas of learning and development: 3 prime areas and 4 specific areas which are all planned for and assessed as an ongoing support for development.

Physical Development	Moving and Handling and Health and Self-care
Personal, Social & Emotional Development	Making relationships, self-confidence, self-awareness and managing feelings and behaviour

Expressive Arts and Design	Exploring and using media and materials, being imaginative

Children at Renaissance enjoy the challenges and rewards offered from specific teaching strategies, attention to active engagement with hands-on learning activities, collaborative opportunities and critical thinking skill development. At the heart of the EYFS is the fundamental belief that all children are unique in their learning pathways and possess strengths and competencies which teachers embrace and weave into their curriculum planning to ensure personal motivation.

Primary School

LOWER PRIMARY Year 1, 2 and 3	The school adopts a creative approach to curriculum delivery with a strong cross-curricular approach. Apart from core instruction in Mathematics, Language and the associated PYP units, specialist teachers provide instruction in Music, Physical Education, Swimming, Vietnamese Language / Vietnamese Language and Culture and Library. From Year 2, students have the opportunity to study French or Chinese. Technology is an important feature in the curriculum and is integrated in the programme.
UPPER PRIMARY Year 4, 5 and 6	In addition to a creative approach to curriculum delivery and strong cross-curricular approach, there is an equally strong focus on academic rigour, on the integration of technology and on developing and enhancing research, critical thinking and problem solving skills. Core instruction is in Mathematics, Language and the associated PYP units; specialist teachers provide instruction in Music, Physical Education, Swimming, Vietnamese Language / Vietnamese Language and Culture and Library. French and Chinese are offered as third languages.

Secondary School

MYP Years 7,8 and 9	Based on the National Curriculum of England but modified in part to suit the needs of a diverse international student population; Students studying the MYP follow an inquiry based concept curriculum which involves subjects in English, Mathematics, Science, the Humanities, The Arts (Art, Music, Drama), Design and Technology (DT), Vietnamese, a third language and Physical Education. There is a strong emphasis on cross curricular links across the MYP and all students are involved in Service Learning.
IG Years 10 and 11	Students are involved in a programme that culminates in the International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE) at the end of Year 11. Designed and administered by Cambridge Assessment, the IGCSE has been specifically created for international students and leads to a certificate that is internationally recognised. The core subjects – English, Mathematics, Language A and Coordinated Sciences are compulsory; students then choose from a broad range of subjects across the Humanities, Creative, Visual and Performing Arts and Physical Education.
DP Years 12 and 13	Students study the International Baccalaureate Diploma. The prestigious programme provides an excellent pathway into universities and colleges worldwide. Students study six subjects and Theory of Knowledge, Creativity, Activity and Service requirements plus an Extended Essay. For students not involved in the IB Diploma, a Renaissance High School Diploma is available.

Languages

Foreign Languages: Renaissance offers a diverse language programme. In addition to EAL (English as an Additional Language) instruction, students from Year 2 and above study Vietnamese as well as French and Chinese Mandarin. Korean is offered as a mother language from Year 10.

SEN The school has a strong Special Educational Needs Department. For any questions on this area please contact the SEN coordinator.

EAL Renaissance offers a highly-experienced and trained EAL department who will tailor EAL support to the needs of each individual student. Renaissance is renowned for its EAL support.

Counsellor

Our Student Counsellor is trained and experienced in providing the best support to our students for academic and emotional counselling, guidance counselling and University admissions.



NON-ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES

Sports

All students across the range of Early Years to Year 13 are involved in Physical Education classes and the school has a strong commitment to sport.

Our facilities include a large 6000m² sports field, a smaller internal field, a 25 metre pool and a large indoor gymnasium.

Trips & Visits

Educational residential and field trips and visits are a key feature of our curriculum. For older children they are an essential element as they add to their university application. We build such activities around the Round Square approach which promotes six IDEALS of learning: Internationalism, Democracy, Environmentalism, Adventure, Leadership and Service. It is common practice in schools for such costs to be in addition to school fees. However, we always work hard to make sure that such activities are affordable for our families.

Service Learning

There is a strong commitment to service learning at Renaissance and the school offers a range of designated and age appropriate service learning opportunities.

Round Square Initiatives

Renaissance is dedicated to working with the students and the parent community to ensure that the Round Square IDEALS (Internationalism, Democracy, Environmentalism, Adventure, Leadership and Service) are embedded within the school culture. Students make a commitment to addressing each of the areas of IDEALS through residential trips, educational visits, work projects, community service and international awards. The common goal is to ensure the full and individual development of every student as a whole person through the simultaneous realisation of academic, physical, cultural and spiritual aspirations. 

National Curriculum for England

Renaissance follows the National Curriculum for England, which sets out the programmes of study and attainment targets for all subjects in most year groups in Primary and Secondary. The curriculum is structured for students aged 5 – 16, for each of which certain subjects must be taught. The National Curriculum aims to support the statutory duties of schools to offer a curriculum which is balanced and broadly based.

PARENT ENGAGEMENT & COMMUNICATIONS

A family-friendly, child-centred environment.

Parents and families are always welcome in our school, and many families join us because we have an exceptionally family-friendly environment.

Parents can also help in their child's class for 'one-off' events or on-going projects. Having parent helpers in for activities means that we can utilise expertise for specific projects and it ensures that we have extra pairs of eyes on events such as field trips. If you want to help, please contact your class teacher. Parent can also help in the library. Please contact the Librarian directly to discuss how you can get involved.

If you like to come into school to see how your child is progressing, please make an appointment with the teacher. For child protection, and health & safety reasons we do not allow unannounced visitors.

Parent Communication

We have in-house tracking systems in place to follow a student's progress from the moment they arrive at Renaissance. These are carefully monitored to ensure that development is continuous and any issues are detected early to allow for immediate consultation with parents and students.

Seesaw updates and messages are the main form of communication between home and school for Primary and Early Years parents. Each Friday, teachers post updates with photos and videos to showcase the learning from the week. Parents are encouraged to use Seesaw to message all staff when asking questions, making requests or booking a meeting time.

In Primary and Early Years, all students receive Progress Reports twice a year. We also have 1 parent conference to discuss student progress as well as 1 Student Led Conference where students have the opportunity to showcase their learning.

Parents receive 4 reports a year in Secondary. (3 in year 11 and 13). We also have 1 parent & teacher meeting a year and 1 student led conference day, where students can show off their work to their parents.

In addition, all teachers allocate regular times each week to parent meetings.



FEES & SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships

When our school was founded it was always intended that Renaissance would serve and support its community and provide high quality education. We offer qualifying students a fee discount on entering our IB programme with scholarships of up to 80% available for high performing students.

When Your Employer Pays Your Tuition Fees

The company/employer must advise the school in writing on company letterhead confirming that it is responsible for the payment of fees. They can either come to our school and pay the fees to the cashier or transfer to the school account.

Withdrawal Policy

Parents must advise the school 90 calendar days in advance before the expected departure dates so that any refund will be processed. The withdrawal can be submitted by completing a withdrawal form and submitting it to our Admissions Office. For the refund amount, please see our Schedule of Fees. The Withdrawal Refund is applicable only to Annual Tuition Fees that were paid on time i.e. paid on or before the due date. Your Security Deposit will be refunded in full given that the required 90-days' notice is provided.

Force Majeure

In the case of a force majeure caused by events beyond the school's control - including but not limited to - epidemics, natural disasters, acts of terrorism, pandemics, wars, social unrest - the school has the right to replace, reduce or adjust the learning schedule and method of instruction so as to suit the context at that time. In such cases, the school has no obligation to refund any portion of the fees paid (except for meals and transportation, if any) and the parent/s are responsible for the full payment of all fees to ensure the completion of the academic year.



UNIVERSITY APPLICATIONS

We have a dedicated full-time University & College Counsellor who supports all Secondary students and their parents with their university and study subject choices, and university applications.
